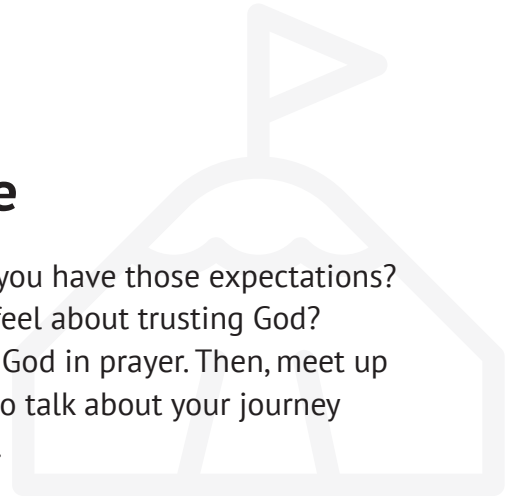

This Week’s Discussion Questions

3. [Read Mark 4:35–41](#). What do the disciples question when they wake Jesus in the boat during the storm? When are you most likely to question whether Jesus cares about you? Why do you think that is?
4. What kinds of people/products/groups do you follow on social media? What would it take for you to “unfollow” them? Why do some people decide to “unfollow” Jesus?
5. What sorts of things do you expect Jesus to give you? How do you feel when He doesn’t? How about when He does? How has following Jesus been different than you expected?

Challenge

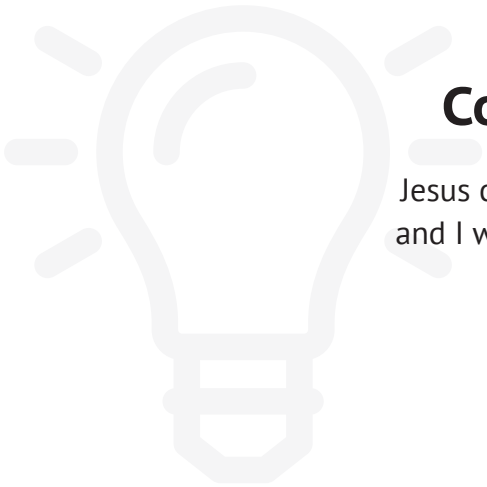
Reflect on your expectations for God. Why do you have those expectations?
