



Unashamed





This Week's Discussion Questions


1. In much of the world today—as in Bible times—shame and honor are vital concerns. This is, in part, because life is viewed more on the basis of community than individuality. How does the Western lens of the individual differ so dramatically from the Eastern lens of community (family, village, etc.)?
2. [Read Hebrews 11:16](#). As the writer describes God's relationship with His children, is it surprising that He is not ashamed to be called their God? Why?
3. [Read Hebrews 2:11](#). What does it say of Christ's love for us that He is not ashamed to be called our brother?
4. [Read Romans 1:16](#). Because crucifixion was considered both humiliating and disgraceful, Paul's declaration that he is not ashamed of the gospel would undoubtedly have shocked his first hearers. Why would the thought of a crucified God have been a difficult message to present in ancient Rome?


Commit To Memory
